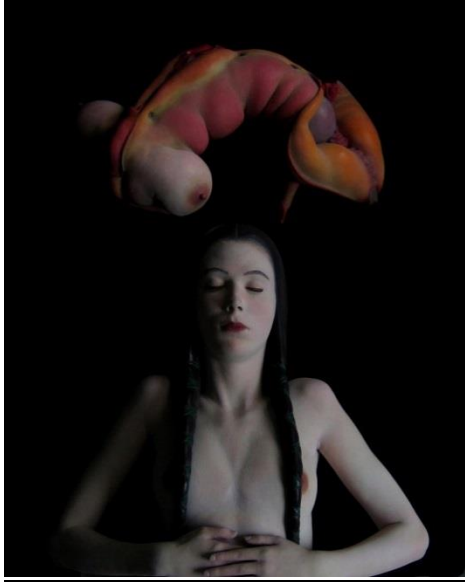


JUDY FOX

Judy Fox studied sculpture at Yale and Skowhegan. She received a Masters in Art History and Conservation from the Institute of Fine Arts at NYU. Fox started showing in the East Village in 1985, pioneering contemporary figuration with her painted nude children. Since then has participated in numerous private and public exhibitions around the US, and Europe. She has received many awards, including two NEA grants, and awards from the "Anonymous Was a Woman" foundation and the American Academy of Arts and Letters. She is a 2006 fellow of the John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation and a 2009 fellow of the New York Foundation for the Arts. Most recent solo exhibitions have been at The Contemporary Museum, Honolulu; PPOW Gallery, NY; Ace Gallery, Beverly Hills; and Ropac Gallery, Paris.

Judy Fox is represented by PPOW Gallery. She lives and works in New York

WHAT TO EXPECT:

- Judy will be leading a portrait modeling class during which students will work from a model.

REQUIRED MATERIALS:

- 15in head armature (provided)
- Water based clay (50lbs provided)
- 1 wood stick, around 1 x 2 x 18" (for hitting clay)
- Plastic sheet (for covering clay)
- Long Pointy Kitchen Knife
- Water Spray Bottle
- large toothed loop tool (see below)
